Summer Holiday Activity Provision

- DAY provided 4 weeks of holiday provision delivered throughout August 2019, using the funding from the parish council, (Please see final page for a visual example of our activities)
- DAY engaged with 64 individuals from West Rainton during the 10 trips and activities that were delivered. Every Monday afternoon the young people from West Rainton participated in a half day activity of their choice and on Thursdays and Fridays they participated in full day activities in the company of young people from Pitlington and Sherburn Village. The full day sessions were trips away from the local area.
- Monday evening youth sessions continue throughout summer for young people to access so they had a choice of trips, youth project or both. This offer was well received by parents both for helping with childcare but also for the cost.
- The combination of Thursday and Friday trip was based on feedback from the young people wanting to engage with other villages but also at a practical level to ensure staff coverage for Durham Area Youth when providing holiday provision to three villages. This allowed for all children to benefit, the cost to be split between 3 parish councils fairly depending on attendance and a regular provision each week incorporating a longer distance full day trip.
- All the activities delivered were planned with the young people, taking into consideration what they wanted to do and group interests. The Youth Forum designed questionnaires to gain ideas from the wider group. Once they gained all the information needed, they brought their findings to the staff team who worked alongside them to plan the activities and get the relevant paperwork in place, such as risk assessments.
- All participants gained new skills from our activity program, from learning to work as part of a team, skating, how to read coordinates for geo caching, how to stay safe in environments that are unfamiliar to them and how to organise and plan activities.

WHAT'S TO COME FOR WEST RAINTON YOUTH PROJECT

- Young people are busy working on their circus character to enter into the village show
- Once Ron Hogg returns to work the young people will be working alongside him and his team to do a clean up around the village. The young people will be encouraging the wider community to get involved.
- The young people are happy to support the bulb planting around the village in planning with the Parish Council
- We have secured future funding from County Durham Sport Satellite Club Grant to carry on our football session on a Friday evening, as the dark nights have previously proved unpopular and unsafe due to no lighting, we will be delivering boxing sessions in the hall which has been requested by the young people. This is aimed at 14+ to engage them with positive activity on a Friday evening and divert them from negative behaviour. The attendance is growing at this session and allowing new young people to engage with project.
- 3 young people from the village represent West Rainton in the youth forum and have been invited to the Houses of Parliament to learn more about how decisions are made and how they can use their voice to influence and change legislation that impacts on young people.
- The young people have been working hard on putting together dances and other talents for Durham Area Youth's got Talent to be held on Saturday 21st September.. This show will be used as a fund raiser with the support of parents and volunteers. The staff will also be

using the talent show to give out awards to all the young people as recognition of how they have grown and learnt new skills in the time they have been attending the sessions.

- Young people will be participating in the “Make your mark” vote. This is lead by the UK youth parliament, the young people have a choice of 10 subjects and pick 2 that are most important to them. The top 3 subjects voted for will be discussed in Parliament to encourage the voice of young people to be heard.
- We are working with parents and carers to hold a consultation on the youth services and gather feedback following the holiday provision. The aim is to work with parents and carers to continually shape the service going forward to their needs and the young people’s ideas and suggestions. One idea shared is for a family fun day which we will be exploring with them further as an idea. We have also been approached in terms of toddler provision for pre school age and will be discussing this with families further.
- Durham Area Youth have applied for grant funding from the Ballinger Trust to run an education and training project with over 13s living within the travelling community to reengage them with education and training with the hope to lead into employment. A decision on the success of this funding will be made by the end of September. The project going ahead is funding dependent.
