In an Emergency

Callers should only ring 999 when

- Life is at risk
- Persons are badly injured
- A crime is in the process of being committed
- Offenders are nearby
- There has been a serious disruption to the flow of traffic

In a non-emergency call 101

101 is an easy to remember non-emergency police number and is in use across England, Scotland and Wales.

Calls to 101 cost 15p per call, no matter what time of day it is, or how long the call lasts. This means everyone calling the police will know exactly how much a call costs, whether they're calling from a landline or a mobile phone

Noise Complaints

We are responsible for dealing with some noise complaints that are classed as a 'statutory nuisance'. If the noise is causing a statutory nuisance, we will try to resolve the matter informally. However, if this approach fails, we have the legal powers to serve an abatement notice requiring the nuisance to stop.

There are a number of different noise sources that can cause a nuisance:

- barking dogs
- amplified music
- industrial and commercial premises
- construction and demolition sites
- public entertainment from licensed premises

There are certain types of noise where we have no legal powers to act:, including noise from aircraft, trains and road traffic.
